Tony Sheffy, president of the executive board, said the event was a "kickoff" and would communicate the group's mission to the general public.

"Ever since I was a kid, I've been really focused on imagination," Sheffy said. "The idea of helping to create additional programs that could spark kids' imaginations really drew me in. I hope that we are able to create programs that instill a love of learning."
