A. Welcome/Call to Order -

The meeting was called to order at 6:33 pm.

B. Approval of the January Minutes

There were no additions or corrections to the 1/9/24 minutes.

Paula moved to accept the minutes, seconded by Dianne. The minutes were approved.

C. Treasurer's Report – Dianne Quinn

- The treasurer's report was shared on Google Drive.
- Checking account balance at this time = \$62,222.89.
- Expenses included two \$1,000 scholarship payments
- Income included a \$2,000 donation from the Knight family and an Honor-an-Educator donation of \$50.23.
- Ellen moved to accept the treasurer's report, seconded by Nancy R. All were in favor.
 The treasurer's report was accepted.
- Dianne reported that annual payments will need to be made to Benevity and Constant Contact.
- o A question was raised about a tax filing form. Dianne will check with George.
- o Paula raised the question of when and if an audit should be considered.
- The Goralski Family Scholarship account shows over \$100 in interest each month. A
 percentage of the interest was intended to be earmarked for SEF's use. This needs
 to be officially pinned down so that transfers to SEF checking can take place.

1. Scholarship – Ann

o The final two scholarship awards have been paid.

- Page will be the new contact person, in the library to collect SEF's scholarship applications.
- Peg volunteered to help read scholarship applications.

2. Events Committee – Paula

- a. Next Meeting March 20, 6:30 on Zoom.
- b. Grant Celebration Ellen

Six grant awardees have been invited to present. So far, 3 have confirmed their availability, 1 sent regrets, and 2 others have yet to respond.

- c. <u>Historical Scavenger Hunt</u> Nancy R.
 - o This event is intended for the fall, possibly October.
 - Nancy R has been in touch with Liz Kopec who has offered to help.
 - The Historical Society will be involved.
 - Nancy also shared news of an upcoming event at Barnes on April 3rd called
 "The Crime of the Century" which has a Southington connection.
- d. Cider Tasting at Rogers Orchard Nancy R.
 - o The date is set for May 8th when the cider bar will be closed to the public.
 - Nancy R connected with Missy at Bread-For-Life who offered to help organize the event.
 - Bread-for-Life's fall fundraiser sold 60 tickets at \$40 each.
 - Nancy R asked about the need for a liquor license if wine is served and if we need to purchase event insurance.
 - Nancy is also looking into a small (3-piece) live band.
 - Auction In addition to the Adirondack chair, members offered to look into other possible items: a second Adirondack chair, VIP graduation tickets, a food share from LEAF, Southington Country Club golf, an Old Mill gift certificate, and Bushnell tickets.

3. Program Committee

- a. Katie reported that work is underway for a follow up to the "Reading With Our Minds & Hearts" program grant which will be aimed at older students. She also had an opportunity to observe a kindergarten lesson using one of the new decodable books from last year's program grant.
- b. Paula reported that a meeting took place with Steve on two program ideas: 1)
 Robotics for middle and elementary level students in partnership with Park & Rec.,
 and 2) Developing the land next to DePaolo into a working farm, along with the
 Heritage Foundation.

4. Grant Committee

- a. Approval of Grant Building Thinking Classrooms in Mathematics Gr. 2-5
 - The blinded application had been previously shared electronically with questions raised and answered. Ellen read aloud the teacher's response to some of the questions.
 - Lisa raised a question about the 100% metric used in the grant. Frank explained how 100% is a target for all in the district, the use of two lenses – achievement and growth.
 - Nancy G moved to accept and fully fund the Building Thinking Classrooms in Mathematics grant, seconded by Paula. All were in favor. The grant passed unanimously.

b. Project Evaluation - Book Tasting
