**Call to Order** – Paula Knight called the meeting to order at 6:32 pm.

### A. Approval of February Minutes

There were no additions or corrections made to the 2/14/23 minutes.

# **B.** February Treasurer's Report

- The treasurer was absent. Accounting is from submitted report:
- Deposits included \$60.31 from Amazon Smile; \$6.97 in interest; gala deposits of \$100 from DePaolo, \$40.50 from J. Belanger; and a \$240 Testa/Raytheon donation.
- Expenses included \$423 to Constant Contact and \$1,000 for the Book-Tasting grant.

- TOTAL ASSETS—\$75,122.22.
- o Questions raised could not be answered. Action was tabled until next month.

#### C. Committee Work

#### 1. Grant Committee Report – Jan

 Winter Grant – A \$1000 deposit was made for the Book Tastings grant as we await the listing of specific titles to be purchased.

- Spring Grant One application was received, returned for revisions, and not resubmitted.
- Why so few applications this year? Steve shared that teachers feel worn out and stressed from post-pandemic pressures. Paula responded that SEF would be open to ways we might be able to help in that regard.

## 2. Program Committee – Michelle and Katie

- The Barnes Trust application will be submitted on Friday, with a request of \$40,000.
- Barnes allows only one initiative at a time.
- We are seeking funds for diverse decodable books for 27 K-2 classes.
  Stephanie Lawlor describes the books sought as Windows and Mirrors.
- Working community engagement into the school reading plan is yet to be determined.

### 3. Scholarship Committee - Ann

- All applications are being vetted and blinded in order to go out to readers by the end of the month.
- o Steve offered his office for help with scanning and copying.
- Scholarship recipient names must be submitted to SHS by April 14<sup>th</sup>.
- o The Awards assembly will be on May 8th.

#### 4. Gala Update

- Tops catering has come in at \$20 per person for stations with a Mexican flair.
  Dessert still needs to be worked out.
- Steve suggested we consider using the high school's Corner Cafe for dessert.
  Steve and Paula will follow up.
- o The Mtn. Room will charge \$1500 for the room, bartender, and outdoor games.
- o Jerry reported that tickets started selling and we already sold two full tables.
- New auction ideas Lisa initiated contact with ax-throwing and the escape room.
- Jan & Ellen will collect and organize auction items.
- Ellen made a motion on behalf of the decorating committee to have a working budget of \$100. Seconded by Jan. The motion passed.
- The next Event/Gala meeting will be at 6:30 on Monday, March 20.

#### D. New Business

#### 1. A.I. Summer Camp

- Steve presented the group with a summer program offering some cutting-edge tech opportunities that he would love to be able to offer to some advanced level students.
- The courses are virtual and tiered for middle high school students (1-week introductory and 3-week intermediate level courses).
- Eventually they can train our own teachers to teach their curriculum.
- Steve will be assessing teacher and student interest and will get back to us.
- Steve will be sending a link to the slides used in Steve's presentation.
